#### **Identification Cards**

DMV issues non-driver identification (ID) cards to people of all ages who are <u>domiciled in Oregon</u> and do not already have a valid Oregon ID Card or a current valid driver license or instruction permit from Oregon or any other jurisdiction. An identification card is issued for identification purposes only.

Oregon is a <u>Central Issuance</u> state so you will not be issued a card at the time of your application or renewal. Once you meet all of the requirements, you will be issued an interim identification card to use until you receive your permanent identification card in the mail.

#### Getting an ID Card

You must apply for an original identification (ID) card in person at a DMV office. To apply, you must:

- Fill out the Driver License/Identification Card form;
- Provide proof of your full legal name;
- · Provide proof of your legal presence in the U.S., identity and date of birth;
- Provide proof of your Social Security Number (SSN);
- Provide proof of your Oregon residence address;
- Provide a valid <u>mailing address</u>;
- Pay the original application fee; and
- Surrender any valid driver license or permit issued by Oregon or any other jurisdiction.

## NOTE: Each time you apply for an ID card you are required to present proof of your legal presence in the U.S., full legal name, identity, date of birth, Social Security Number and Oregon residence address (if changed).

#### Renewing an ID Card

You must renew an identification (ID) card in person at a <u>DMV office</u>. To renew, you must:

- · Provide proof of your full legal name;
- Provide proof of your legal presence in the U.S., identity and date of birth;
- Provide proof of your Social Security Number (SSN);
- Provide proof of residence address, if changed;
- Provide a valid mailing address; and
- Pay the <u>renewal fee</u>.

#### Out-of-State?

If you are currently out-of-state and your ID card expires, you will have to apply for a replacement or renewal at a <u>DMV office</u> in Oregon when you return.

#### Replacing an ID Card

DMV will issue a replacement identification (ID) card if your current card is lost, stolen, mutilated or destroyed; or if you have a <u>name change</u> or <u>address change</u>. To replace an ID card, you must appear in person at a <u>DMV office</u>, where you will be asked to:

- Provide proof of your full legal name;
- Provide proof of your legal presence in the U.S., identity and date of birth;

- Provide proof of your Social Security Number (SSN);
- Present acceptable proof(s) of your name change, if applicable;
- If your address has changed, you will be required to present proof of your Oregon residence address;
- Provide a valid mailing address; and
- Pay the <u>replacement fee</u>.

#### Out-of-State?

If you are currently out-of-state and your ID card is lost, stolen, or damaged, you will have to apply for a replacement or renewal at a <u>DMV office</u> in Oregon when you return.

#### **Frequently Asked Questions**

I am moving back to Oregon from another U.S. state. When I lived in Oregon previously, I had an Oregon ID Card. How do I re-apply for an Oregon ID Card now that I'm a resident again?

In most cases, if your Oregon ID Card is still valid or has been expired for less than one year, you only have to:

- Provide proof of your full legal name;
- · Provide proof of your legal presence in the U.S., identity and date of birth;
- Provide proof of your SSN;
- Provide proof of current Oregon residence address;
- Provide a valid mailing address; and
- Pay an ID card <u>replacement fee</u> (if Oregon ID Card is still valid) or <u>renewal fee</u> (if Oregon ID Card has been expired for less than one year).

However, if your previous Oregon ID card is expired for over one year, you will have to re-apply for an original (refer to the <u>Getting An ID Card</u> section above).

## If my ID card expires or is lost, damaged or stolen while I am out of the state, is there a way I can get a replacement sent to me?

No. You will have to apply for a replacement or renewal at a Oregon <u>DMV office</u> when you return to the state.
