Reserve early! Reserve campsites at Memaloose two days to nine months in advance by phone, Reservations Northwest (1-800-452-5687), or online through www.oregonstateparks.org.

Ainsworth, Memaloose and Viento state parks offer seasonal camping amidst the splendor of a national scenic treasure.

Ainsworth (Open Mid-March–October)

- 43 full hookup sites (sewer, electricity, water; 24 pull-through)
- Paved parking, picnic table, fire ring at all sites
- 6 walk-in tent sites
- 1 campsite (B31) accessible to campers with disabilities
- Flush toilets and hot showers
- RV dump station (please use to dump a full holding tank instead of a campsite connection)
- Gorge Trail 400 connection

Viento (Open Mid-March–October)

- 56 electrical sites with water
- 18 tent sites with water nearby
- 1 campsite (A26) accessible to campers with disabilities
- Paved parking, picnic table, fire ring at all sites
- Flush toilets and hot showers
- Day-use area with river access for swimming, windsurfing

Memaloose (Open Mid-March–October)

(Eastbound access: take Exit 76 and return westbound 3 miles on freeway. Drive through rest area to campground entrance.)

- 44 full hookup sites (sewer, electricity, water)
- 66 tent sites with water nearby
- Paved parking, picnic table, fire ring at all sites
- Flush toilets and hot showers (solar heated)
- RV dump station
- No safe or legal river access

Camping Rates

Rates for state park campsites are subject to change. You can find up-to-date information by calling 1-800-551-6949, or visiting www.oregonstateparks.org.

Discovery Season

From October 1 - April 30, you can rent a full, electric or tent site for less. At most state parks, including Ainsworth, Memaloose and Viento, you can save \$4 off summer rates (during the times these parks are open).

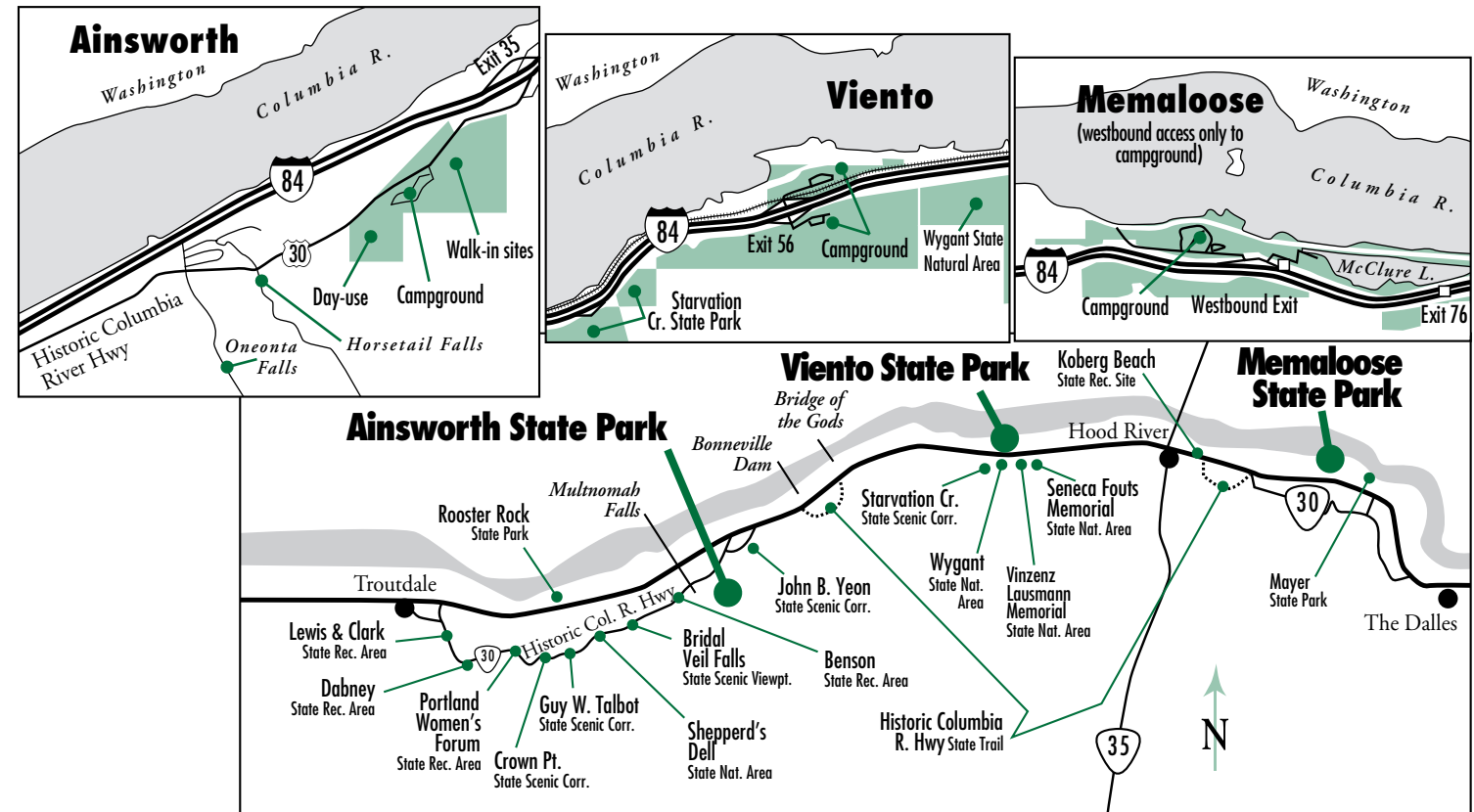

Day-Use Adventures

State park day-use areas are gateways to sightseeing, hiking, windsurfing and more in the Columbia River Gorge National Scenic Area. Enjoy waterfalls, hiking trails and views of the gorge from several state parks along the Historic Columbia River Highway, including Guy W. Talbot State Park with a short trail to the 249 - foot Latourell Falls. Spectacular 620-foot Multnomah Falls is only four miles west of Ainsworth State Park.

Day-Use Area Fees

Day-use parking permits are required year-round at Rooster Rock, Benson, Dabney, East Mayer, Viento and the Twin Tunnels trailheads on the Historic Columbia River Highway State Trail. You will need to display a daily, 12-month or 24-month permit or your camping receipt, which is equal to a daily permit for those days registered. Daily permits are sold at the parks, annual permits are available at most major state park offices.

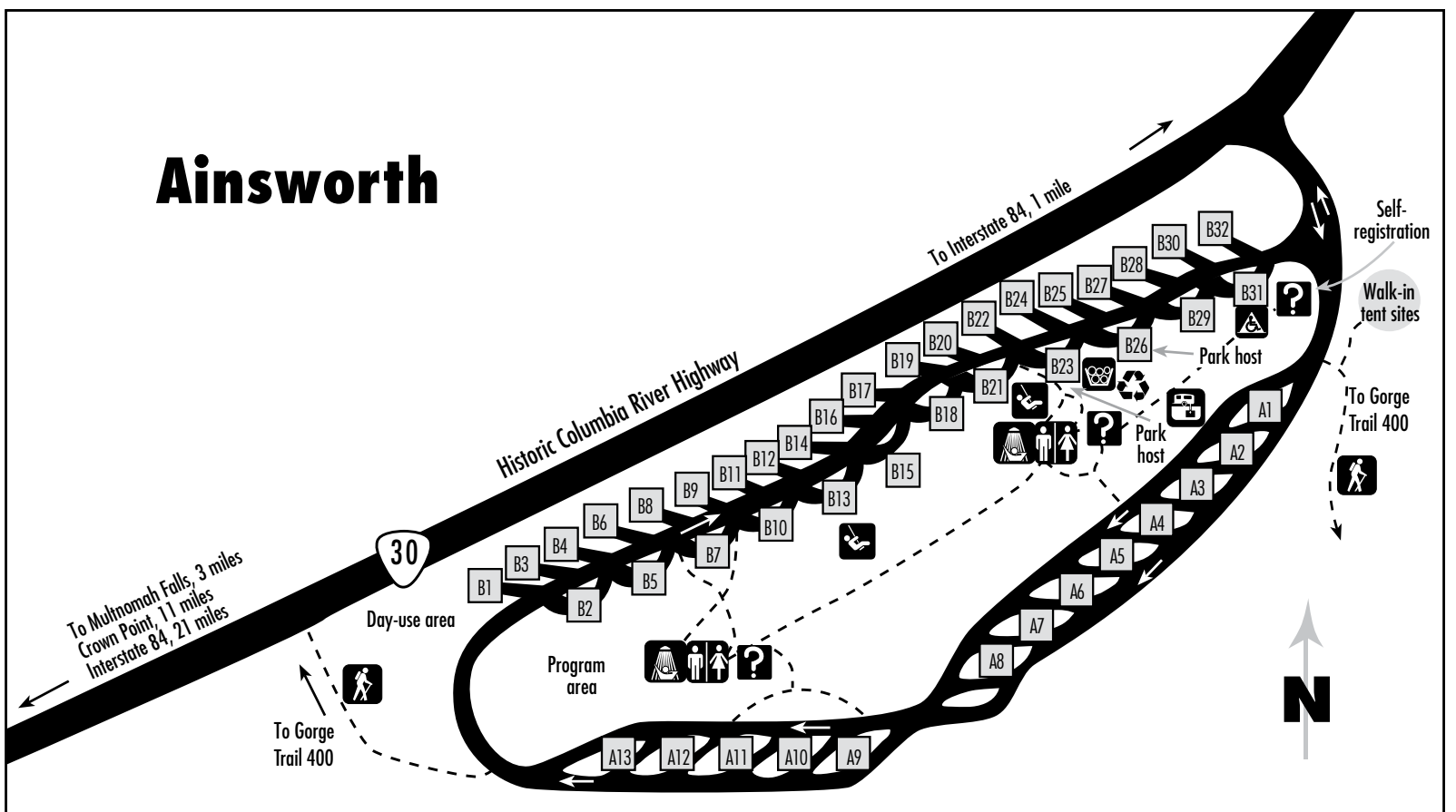

Historic Columbia River Highway State Trail

Hikers and bikers enjoy breathtaking views of the Columbia River Gorge from the Historic Columbia River Highway State Trail. The Mosier Twin Tunnels stretch is a paved five-mile route between two trailheads. A visitor station lies on the west end. Cascade Locks to Tanner Creek, near the Bonneville dam offers 5 miles of mostly flat hiking/biking. An additional two miles between Moffit Creek and John B Yeon State Park are still under construction. All segments of the trail are rated moderate to difficult for people with disabilities. Additionally the Starvation Creek trail in Viento State Park is one mile long and connects with US Forest Service trails for more difficult hikes. All pets must be on leashes not more than 6 feet in length.

Please help make camping at Ainsworth, Viento and Memaloose a safe and enjoyable experience by following these and other park rules:

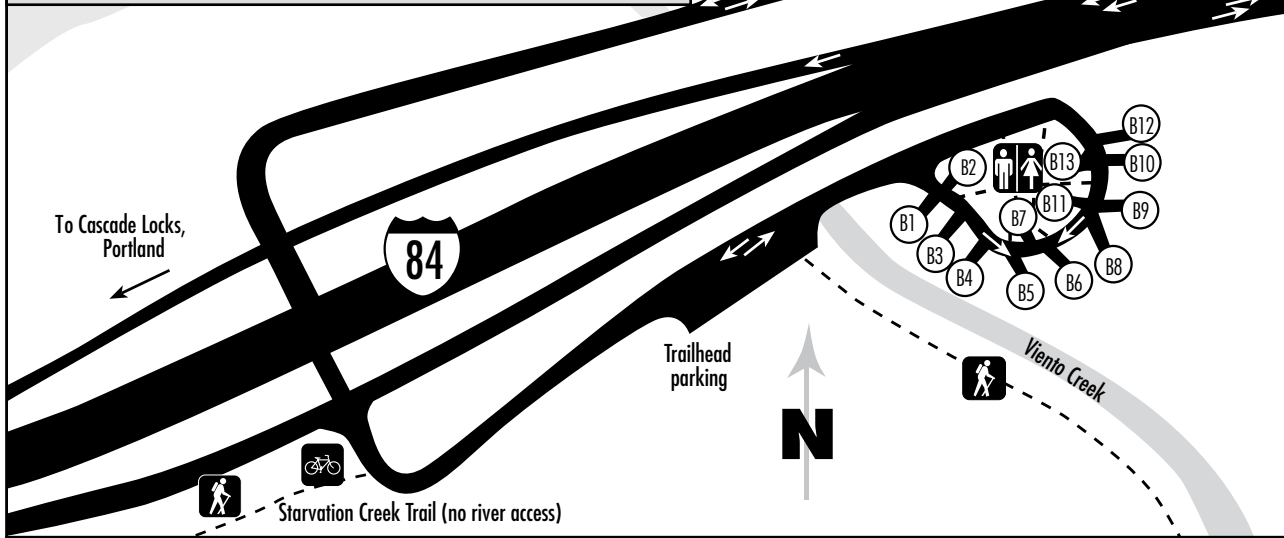
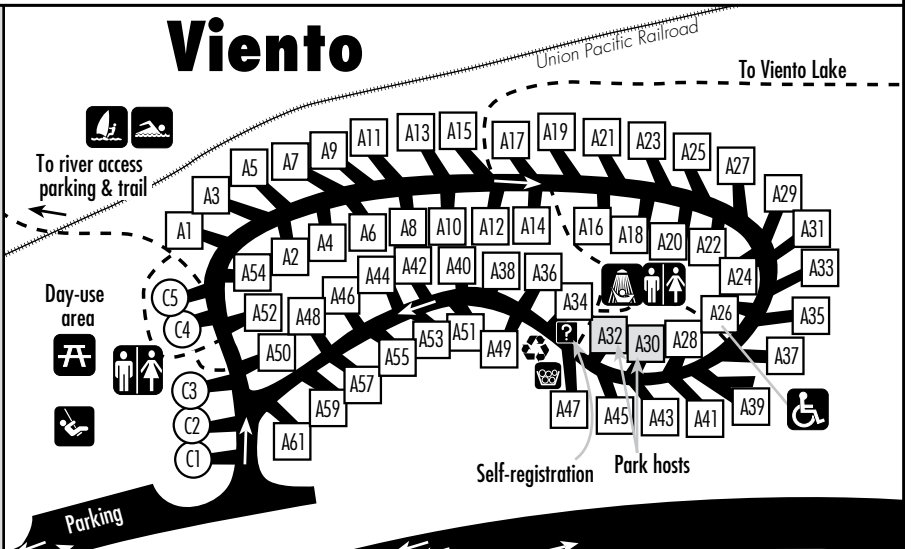
- Campground quiet hours are between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m.
- Vehicles must be parked on paved areas only.
- Bicycles are permitted on park roads, but ride them with the traffic flow. Riders under age 16 must wear helmets.
- When your pet is not confined in a vehicle or tent, you must hold it, hold on to its collar or physically control it on a leash that is no longer than six feet. Wastes must be properly removed. (For details, ask for our "Pets in the Parks" brochure.)

Check-in after 4 p.m., **Check-out** by 1 p.m.

NOTE: Heavy train traffic on the Union Pacific Railroad, which crosses Viento State Park between its A loop campsites and the Columbia River, is heard most prominently in sites A1-A31.

RV dump stations are available at Ainsworth and Memaloose.
